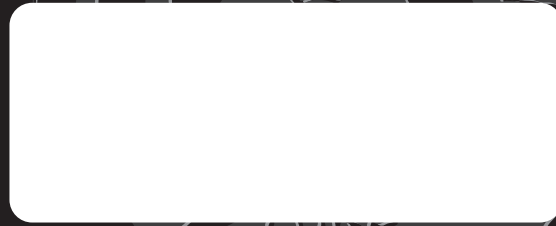
Oh what manner of love the Father has given unto to us that we are called sons of the Living Vibrant God!

**CANAAN MINISTERIAL TRAINING CENTRE (CMTC, NEPAL)
GRADUATION CEREMONY REPORT**

Thanks and Glory be to God for this glorious day because we were able to commit and send more workers into His harvest field. On this day we celebrated with CMTC's 36th batch of trainees at their Graduation ceremony.

The ceremony was conducted by Nanda Rai one of the teachers at CMTC. Opening prayer was by Ps. Mitra Rai. Mr Suren Mukhiya shared the blessing representation of all students. He shared many important things the students had learned during their training.



Dr Samuel Sangram Rai shared an encouraging message from the book to Timothy, about holding onto their faith. It was very encouraging to all of us as leaders of churches who are facing the challenges of false teachings and persecution from government. The word of God says keep holding the faith till the day of the Lord. The Ceremony was closed in prayer by Elder Ganesh Bahadur Gurung.

Often students come from distant regions of Nepal where they are economically very poor, but they have a vision of working for God in their own village. Students are always very blessed, encouraged, strengthened and empowered by the training. Following are some of their testimonies:



Dal Bahadur Thapa Magar

My name is Dal Bahadur Thapa and I am from Gorkha. There are eight members in my family (me, my wife, three sons and three daughters). Before accepting Christ I was a Hindu, worshipping idols, nature and ancestral spirits. I have done all kinds of rituals as a Hindu devotee with the expectation they could protect my family, give prosperity, heal all the sickness and give salvation too. But there was nothing like this in my life. Instead I was addicted to drinking. This caused many problems and quarrels in my family. I used to work and whatever I earned I used it to buy alcohol. After drinking I would often fight with my friends, got injured and hospitalized.

I knew I was going the wrong way but when I saw alcohol I could not control myself. I wanted to stop but was unable to until a pastor came to my home and shared about Jesus Christ and my family accepted. But I could not because I was a devotee of Hindu lord Shiva. My family would often encourage I turn to Christ but I refused, until one day in a dream I saw a cross but could not understand what it was. Then my family took me to church and prayed for me and I stopped taking alcohol.

Since then there has been happiness and peace in my life and family. I realized that I was against God, repented and accepted Jesus Christ as my Lord and Savior. I have a desire to know more about Him, so my family encouraged me to attend bible training to learn more about God's word. In this training I have got new life, physically and spiritually.

I want to give glory and honour to God our Saviour, who helped me to complete my training. I will go back to my village and serve the people of God, and share the Gospel to the people who are still in the bondage of alcohol addiction.

Note from Nanda Rai: Dal is the one whose life has been totally changed through this training. When he first arrived at the training center five months ago, he was very weak because of alcoholic addiction but now he so much stronger in his faith and a source of evangelism in his village. He decided to share those people who are still in the bondage of alcoholic addiction. We training center family are really happy to send him back to be a great witness.

Project Profiles

Maldives SOW Training

School of Workers or SOW Training is a very effective discipleship training programme used extensively by our contacts in Asia and beyond. Wherever it is used, there are always converts, so Mahee has been conducting SOW in Male to help establish a church among the Maldivians.
Total Project: \$7500, Balance needed: \$6005.

Himalayas

Nepal Radio Programme Ministry (NEPRAD)

GTN currently broadcasts three radio programmes from Pokhara - in the Nepali, English and Gurung languages, and reaches approximately 1 million people. Your prayer and support is of great value for the success of this programme. **Monthly Goal: \$700. Amount received last month \$465.**

Nepal Bible College (NPBC)

The cost of running the training programmes for one year with two batches of students is \$1600 each month. **Amount received last month \$850**

MO hopes to provide 3,000 of these good quality Nepali New Testaments with Q&A. Each book costs \$4.30. **Total Cost: \$12,900, Balance needed \$2936**

1000 Equipping Centres in One Year

This is an exciting and faith stretching plan to strengthen and grow the church in Nepal through equipping and imparting the 5-Fold ministry gifts to pastors and leaders during the next year and establish a strong, unified network in each region. Over the next 12 months we need to raise another \$72,000 to cover the cost of ink, paper, machine maintenance and wages for those working on this project. **Total Project: \$127,000. Amount still needed: \$72,000**

Kesh Bahadur Pun Magar



My name is Kesh Bahadur Pun and live in Simpani -1, Pokhara along with my wife and three daughters. Before accepting Christ as my saviour, I was a Hindu believer. When I was young I used to see my parents and neighbours worshipping idols, sacrificing animals, going on pilgrimages without knowing why. I used to follow them and do what they did. I was taught that in order to make gods and goddesses happy we need to do sacrifices and worship them. Though I did every kind of Hindu rituals I could not feel that they are happy with me. Somewhere my mother heard the gospel and accepted Jesus Christ. Firstly our family opposed her then once my sister became very sick and was at the point death. At that time some Christians visited our home and gave us gospel tracts with

many Bible verses which taught about John 14:6. That day my sister accepted Christ and threw all the photos and idols of Hindu gods and goddesses away because they were unable to heal her. Then miraculously, she was healed not only of her illness but also from being barren as God opened her womb and she bore children. I heard about all this and kept it in my mind.

Then I went abroad to work and got Christian friends who shared with me about Jesus Christ and encouraged me to go to church which I did. I accepted Jesus as my Lord and Saviour and was baptized. After accepting Christ, my mother and sister were persecuted but I was not since I was not at my home. Then I felt that there are more people in Nepal who did not know about Jesus and His love just like I was living before so I got the vision to do ministry among them with the help of my local church. Without knowing the Bible it was very difficult, so I decided to do training and attended the CMTC.

After the completion of this training I have decided to work and teach in the church, share the Gospel, and lead Bible studies. It is good to us to use what we have learned to help the church we attend.

Suren Mukhiya



My name is Suren Mukhiya from Kaskeri-1, Pokhara. I was born and brought up in a Christian family. I am married and in my family I have my mother, sister, wife, son, two daughters, and two granddaughters. Since I was born and brought up in a Christian family I accepted Jesus as my Lord and Saviour and was baptized 30 years ago. In the beginning days of my Christian faith there was persecution since the country was Hindu which was the only accepted religion. We faced a lot of challenges in those days for our faith but now the country is more democratic so there is not the same problems for accepting Christianity.

Now that I have completed this five month's Diploma in Pastoral Ministries Course at CMTC, I truly thank God who helped me to complete it. I have learned many things for pastoral ministries. I pastor a church here in Pokhara city. I did not have that much bible knowledge but have learned a lot from the training.

Please pray for all the graduates from the 36th batch from CMTC, that the Holy Spirit will continue to lead them into all truth and bring to remembrance the many things they have heard and learned during their training. Pray that they will remain strong in the faith and that their churches and ministries will grow and many will come to know Christ because of them.

China Report:

In April, China banned online Bible sales, with listings pulled from its major online marketplaces and local Amazon affiliate following government plans to retranslate the text to enhance, "Chinese-style Christianity and theology." The Communist country has always regulated the distribution of the Bible, which cannot be sold in commercial brick-and-mortar stores. The government's new religious regulations have fuelled persecution in recent months. One province, Henan, forbid leaders from organizing religious activities involving minors. A church-run kindergarten was dismantled by officials who also destroyed the buildings for several underground churches operating in the region.

NEW PROJECT INTRODUCTION

ONE THOUSAND EQUIPPING CENTRES IN ONE YEAR

Mission Outreach Board are very excited to share with you one of the largest single projects we have been involved in for many years in partnership with Gospel for Tribes & Nations Nepal (GTN).

MO has been involved for 22 years with GTN in Nepal where there is revival taken place, by supporting the School of Workers Training program (SOW), Bible and New Testament printing and distribution, CMTC Bible School that has trained thousands of leaders and pastors and church planters. GTN has also outreached through gospel crusades, TV, Radio and women's ministry called 'Deborah'.

We have been involved with many other projects as well, and together they have been very successful in bringing people to the Lord that there is now a need to equip the leaders to help the church move to the next level in its spiritual walk with the Lord.

So MO has committed to a project named '1000 Equipping Centres in One Year'. The purpose of this is to equip and empower one thousand pastors and leaders in one year by teaching and imparting many spiritual gifts e.g. the five fold which we read of in Ephesians 4:11 "And He Himself gave some to be Apostles, some Prophets, some Evangelists, some Pastors and some Teachers (12) for the equipping of the saints for the work of the ministry for the edifying of the body of Christ"

We will have 3 teams from New Zealand who carry one or more of these five gifts to teach and impart to the 1000 leaders.

The first Equipping Conference will be held in October this year. The second one in March 2019 and the third in October 2019. At each conference we will train 340 pastors over two, two-day seminars. Each seminar will be followed by a networking day to give opportunity to mentor, pray with and encourage each group to work

together, build unity and establish strategies to reach the lost in their region.

Over the course of the next year, the equipped pastors and leaders will return home and commit to train and equip up to another 20 pastors and leaders over the course of a year. So by the end of year two there will be up to 20,000 equipped, many of whom will be church planters. If just 10% become Church planters then there will be 2000 new fellowships started!

Some Pastors will also be coming from Bhutan, Tibet, Nagaland and North East India to be trained. After the first 1000 are trained in Nepal we will expand to these other four Nations to train another 4000. Ultimately each trained pastor may mentor and train up to another 20 leaders and pastors from their region or nation which equates to 100,000 trained and equipped in the five nations.

A Pastor in Tauranga has written a book on the Five-fold ministry gifts called 'Christ Gave Gifts' and a book on Spiritual gifts which are to be translated into the Nepali language and printed for these Equipping conferences. We will also be printing SOW manuals 1, 2 and 3. In total there will be 80,000 pieces of teaching materials printed.

The total cost for the printing and training is \$127,000. We thank the Lord that we have already received \$55,000 and the printing is already in progress. We have another \$72,000 to raise over the next 14 months which will cover the cost of ink, paper and wages for those working on this project.

We invite you to partner with us in prayer and if possible financially for this very large vision for the equipping of the pastors and leaders in Nepal.

BHUTAN – NO FEAR

Bhutan is said to be the last remaining country in which Buddhism in its Vajrayana form, also called Lamaism, is the state religion. It is protected as part of Bhutan's national heritage. Because of this, Christians experience tremendous pressure to conform, and are persecuted accordingly. Believers are compelled to renounce their faith. Christian worship is technically illegal. Congregations meet inside their homes, and they have to do so in a hushed manner because when neighbors complain, their gatherings are in danger of being stopped by the authorities.

Sangmu (not her real name) became a Christian in such an environment. At first, their family did not give much importance to their faith, until they were in a crisis. When she was 16 years old, her widowed mother had womb cancer. She had to help raise her four other siblings by working as a messenger. Her mom's condition worsened and needed to undergo treatment. But they didn't have enough money. It was during those times that they remembered to call on God. "Lord, please show Your mercy and heal our mother." God did! Her mom was completely healed without having surgery!

"That miracle made me re-commit my life to Jesus. Starting from 2009, I became more active in church. There were many challenges. Our church was divided. I was forced to lead because no one wanted to take the responsibility. I tried to run away but I realized that it was really God's plan for me to do this. I really struggled. I quarreled with the Lord saying, 'Lord, I am a woman. I cannot do like a man.' Yet, the Lord confirmed my calling.

I started a church in Daya village. When the village head knew about it, he did not allow us to fellowship there. He threatened to put me in jail and hung me just like Jesus. They even cut the water supply from our church. My children started having questions. 'Do we always have to live in fear because we believe in Jesus?' My faith didn't shake. I just tried to encourage them not to fear or be ashamed even if I am put in jail, because I did not commit any crime. We are serving the One true God who has the power to give us eternal life.

The number of believers are increasing in Daya village. The Lord is with us. Now even my husband, who used to discouraged me, is involved in the ministry. Please uphold us in your prayers. I face so many problems but I should never be weary in doing good so at the right time I can reap the fruit."

Sangmu attended our Church Empowerment Program last May 2018. She was encouraged, ready to go back with renewed strength to fulfill her call from God.

1 (Wed) Pray that Bhutan's young leader, King Jigme Khesar Namgyel Wangchuck, will hear and respond to the gospel of Jesus Christ and find true peace in Him.

2 (Thu) Ask God to increase the believers' witness in their communities, giving them boldness to share their faith.

PAKISTAN

3 (Fri) Pray for the believers' continued creativity in conducting ministry, for their impact in their communities, and for strength and perseverance.

4 & 5 (Sat & Sun) Pray for our persecuted brothers and sisters in Pakistan. Ask God to bless their ministries and aid them in sowing and harvesting the seed of the Gospel.

NORTH KOREA

6 (Mon) Please continue to pray that President Kim will honour his commitments according to the agreement he has signed in regard to his nuclear weapons policies.

7 (Tue) Pray for unjust leaders to be removed and just leaders to be raised up and that it will finally open and set Christian prisoners free.

8 (Wed) It has been reported that many live in very poor conditions and many more bear the marks of torture. Please continue to Pray there is speedy and positive change to their conditions and this nation.

NEPAL

9 (Thu) Pray for the translation of the Christ Gave Gifts book and spiritual Gifts book from English into Nepali language that the translation be accurate. Please ask the Holy Spirit to give the people translating the right Nepali words to express the English language.

10 (Fri) Pray for the people who are doing the work of the printing the books pray for good health for them and their families give them wisdom to print all the material and our over worked printing press will keep going and not have too many breakdowns.

11 & 12 (Sat & Sun) Pray for the 1000 Pastors who will be attending the Equipping training between October this year and October 2019 that they will come expecting an impartation of the Holy Spirit to be able understand and embrace the teaching and go home with a strong vision to appropriate and pass on what they have learned so the church in Nepal will grow exponentially.

MALDIVES

13 (Mon) Pray for Maldivian Christians -- for their protection and courage in the face of great trials and for opportunities to grow in and spread their faith.

14 (Tue) Pray that the religious freedom will be recognized in this country.

MYANMAR

15 (Wed) Pray for an end to the fighting between the Burmese and Kachin Independent Army. Many have lost their loved ones and homes.

16 (Thu) UN Secretary-General Guterres described the violence in Myanmar as ethnic cleansing. Pray the government and its

citizens will have compassion on the Rohingyas and treat them with dignity.

KAREN BORDER COMMUNITIES

17 (Fri) The Kaw Thoo Lei Karen Baptist School and College has opened with over 100 students. Pray for these young people to be empowered to reach the nations for Christ. Pray for the refugees at the Maela camp who were affected by the recent flood. The Bible school and the church were submerged in water. Pray for provisions to come.

LAOS

18 & 19 (Sat & Sun) Pray for the government to address the social situations like drugs, poverty and prostitution in the country.

20 (Mon) Pray for the church's goal to reach one million for Christ and raise 10,000 effective leaders by year 2027.

BANGLADESH

21 (Tue) Pray for Christians who have been displaced, that God would provide for their physical, emotional and spiritual needs.

22 (Wed) Pray for the equipping and training of Christian believers, with special emphasis on emerging leadership and believers from Muslim backgrounds

CHINA

23 (Thu) Fenggang Yang, a leading expert on Christian religion in China said that the current environment for religion in China is regressing back to the era of the Cultural Revolution, during which all religion in China was brutally oppressed. Pray that the church will remain strong.

24 (Fri) Pray for the safety of the believers and churches as persecution has increased in China. Families are torn apart, injuries and psychological damage are inflicted, and lives are lost.

NEW ZEALAND

25 & 26 (Sat & Sun) Pray for those who are on the brink of suicide that they will receive hope, help and grace before they act on their prompting. Pray also for them to be introduced to Jesus and be saved and healed

27 (Mon) Pray for all the homeless in NZ that they will find food and dignified shelter. Pray for all those involved in the drug trade that they may be delivered from their bondage.

VIETNAM

28 (Tue) Pray for preparation for the 30th Anniversary of the Charismatic Movement in Vietnam. Pray that God will bring revival to the church again.

29 (Wed) Pray for God's protection upon His church from heresy.

NE INDIA

30 (Thu) Nearly 650,000 people were affected in last month's flash floods and landslides. The situation is expected to worsen as monsoon season continues. Pray for God's protection upon the people.

31 (Fri) Christian converts from Hindu background face harassment on an almost daily basis and are constantly under pressure to return to Hinduism. Pray for peace and strength in faith. Pray as radical Hindu leaders vowed to rid the country of Christians and Muslims by 2021.
