

Maldives

SOW Training Where ever this is done, there are always converts. We are praying for a church to be established among the Maldavians. Mahee has been conducting SOW in Male and a further \$7,500 is needed to complete the training. **Total amount needed \$7,050.**

Himalayas

Nepal Radio Programme Ministry (NEPRAD)

GTN currently broadcasts three radio programmes from Pokhara - in the Nepali, English and Gurung languages, and reaches approximately 1 million people. Your prayer and support is of great value for the success of this programme. Monthly Goal: \$700. Amount received last month \$635.

Nepal Bible College (NPBC)

The cost of running the training programmes for one year with two batches of students is \$1600 each month. Amount received last month \$1,650 Nepali New Testaments with Q&A

Our dear friend Pastor Samuel Rai has requested from MO to help supply more Nepali New Testaments. This book will contain the New Testament, Psalms and Proverbs. In the back section there are 300 most commonly asked Questions about what Christians believe. MO hopes to provide 3,000 of these good quality Nepali New Testaments with Q&A. Each book will cost \$4.30 each. Total Cost: \$12,900, amount still needed \$3,022

Ethnic Tibetan Orphans

Phurpu and his wife are Ethnic Tibetans living in Kathmandu. They have a ministry to Ethnic Tibetans living along the Nepal/Tibet border in the high mountains. Part of their work involves taking care of a number of orphan children. They have little support to help them with the children. Their monthly expenses are about \$600 US.

We would like to help them by raising \$350 US/month. That is about \$550 NZ depending on exchange rates. Thank you for your help. Amount raised last month \$290.

SOW Training for the Ethnic Tibetans

Phurpu would like to conduct a SOW training among those two groups he met on his trek as well as groups living in other areas. Mission Outreach would like sponsor 4 of these at a cost of \$900 each, with a total \$3,600.

LAOS

Livelihood Training Project Livelihood training centres in Laos provide agricultural and Bible training for Laotian village pastors. Our co-workers in Laos would like to start one in every province of Laos. Mission Outreach would like to raise \$3,000 toward developing these. Amount Needed: \$3,000, amount still needed \$1,624.

INDIA

Houses of Hope – Bhilai (Chattisgar), Garla (Andra Pradesh), Bobili (Andra Pradesh)

The monthly support required to take care of the children is \$740 for Garla and \$300 for Bhilai and \$550 for Bobili. Amount received last month: **Bhilai** (HOHB) \$410, Garla (HOHG) \$660, Bobili \$560. Note: The House of Hope in Bhilai now involves housing the children in private homes, where their care is subsidised by your support.

ASW Training Centre, NE India

We are raising the last instalment to see this training centre completed. The ablutions block has been built and so has the kitchen. The kitchen now needs to be fitted out with benches and cupboards and the wiring, plumbing and painting (inside and out) completed. **Total amount needed \$4,833**.

Disaster Relief Fund

We collect donations into a relief fund so that in the event of an emergency there are funds available to be released immediately. Otherwise it can take 2-3 months for the need to be made known, collected, authorised at our monthly board meetings and then sent. However, funds donated and held for this purpose can be released immediately under authorisation by the board. **Amount currently on hold: \$54**



Myanmar military launches brutal attacks on Christian areas

The people in Myanmar are in desperate need of our prayers as the military renews its offensive against the Christian Kachin people in the north of Myanmar.

Troops using artillery, helicopter gunships and infantry are reportedly setting fire to homes, forcing people to flee in their thousands. Many are believed to have sought refuge in churches. Commentators are drawing parallels between the current offensive and that unleashed against the Muslim Rohingya.

Some reports say that soldiers are using rape as a weapon of war and are deliberately targeting camps for the displaced, which is a war crime. They have also occupied churches and interrogated entire congregations.



Kachin rebel fighters have been a military target for decades but fighting between rebel groups and the military began again in earnest in 2011. The conflict has intensified since April, in areas including Mohnyin and Myitkyina districts.

Getting into the Kachin state now is quite difficult. The Burmese military is attacking from all sides. They have also been able to stop access, not only to journalists, but even local and international aid agencies. Since the beginning of this year, the Burmese military has upped its bombing campaign in different parts of Kachin state.

They want the Kachin Independent Organization (KIO) to sign a peace treaty and subsequently disband the Kachin Independent Army (KIA). Many villages were being bombed and burnt, very similar to the Rohingya community in Rakhine state. The Kachin people were fleeing and hiding in the jungles. They said the government of Myanmar have refused to give aid agencies access to them.

After months of negotiations by the church, some aid finally reached the hundreds of displaced. They have also been prevented from travelling to areas that are under the KIO and are now in camps guarded by the Myanmar military.

Kachin soldiers could be seen patrolling everywhere. On motorbikes with their AK's slung over the shoulders, on the back of 4x4s. Motorbikes seem to be the best mode of transport in this mountainous terrain.



Prayer Calendar – July 2018

Flooding in Maela Refugee Camp, Thailand & NE India We received a report from our co-workers inside the Maela Refugee Camp near the Thai-Myanmar Border that the camp is submerged with water.

The water started to rise up at 10m today and has affected the Maela Bible School, the bible school kitchen, as well as the church near the bible school. According to our coworker, it started to rain non-stop since last night and only stopped this late afternoon. As of this writing, the







Torrential rains over the past few days have triggered flash floods and landslides, wreaking havoc in the states of Assam, Manipur, Mizoram and Tripura. Many were left homeless and roads were washed away in many parts of the state. According to reports, nearly 650,000 people were affected with a reported casualties of 12 people and 26,000 houses were destroyed; the situation is expected to worsen as monsoon season continues.


The Church has been at the forefront of the emergency response, but there is still much more to be done. We ask you to stand with us in prayer with these affected communities, and to help as we respond to the needs. This time the people are in immediate need of shelter and household items (tarpaulin sheets, mosquito net,

kitchen utensils, hygiene kits, safe drinking water, water purification tablets, food items.

Thank you for praying and responding with us to these needs at the moment.







MYANMAR

- 1 (Sun) Please pray for an end to the violence in Myanmar. Pray especially for those who have lost loved ones and homes in recent weeks. Pray that the families affected by persecution will know God's presence and protection and His plan for their lives.
- 2 (Mon) Please pray that the Christians, co-workers, networks and friends in the Kachin state in Myanmar that they will stand firm in their faith despite the challenges they face and for Gods protection over them
- 3 (Tue) Pray for the people in the Maela Refugee Camp as they deal with the disastrous flooding they have recently had. Pray for provision in essential needs of food, water and clothing and for assistance to repair and rebuild.

NORTH KOREA

- 4 (Wed) Last month history was made with the unprecedented meeting between President Kim Jong Un and President Donald Trump. Pray that President Kim will honour his commitments according to the agreement he has signed in regard to his nuclear weapons policies.
- 5 (Thu) Pray that God's will be done in this nation and that God's love and revelation will be imparted to President Kim Jong Un and the people
- 6 (Fri) Pray that the believers in this nation will be strengthened and encouraged and that the nation will be healed from the ravages of the past at the hands of its dictator Presidents
- 7 & 8 (Sat & Sun) A former guard from a concentration camp testified that prisoners live in bunkhouses with 100 people per room, and 30% or more bear the marks of torture. Pray there is speedy and positive change to their conditions and this nation.

- 9 (Mon) Samuels vehicle was attacked recently by radical Hindu while he was driving to an area to conduct SOW training. Please pray protection over Samuel, his co-workers as they travel around the country to minister the gospel or teach.
- 10 (Tue) Samuel had to reschedule the SOW training to a later date and different venue. Please pray for wisdom for everyone involved whether they are organizing, teaching or attending the training that the Lord will go before them and blind the eyes and block the ears of the Hindu radicals so they do not learn where any SOW training venues are and for safety for those teaching and attending.
- 11 (Wed) Thank the Lord for the tremendous revival taking place in many villages throughout Nepal as many come to know Jesus as their saviour. Pray for these new believers that they will receive a revelation of the truth of who Jesus is, and that they leave behind their idol worship.
- 12 (Thu) Please pray for Mangali (Samuel's wife) and her team of ladies who run the Deborah Women's ministry. Pray for their health and safety as they travel round the country.
- 13 (Fri) Pray that the Holy Spirit be upon the Deborah team as they minister for healing and empowerment and for resources and finances to be released

BANGLADESH

- 18 (Wed) Thank the Lord for some breakthroughs and the new prayer partners and financial supporters and please pray for the safety of their Leaders and
- 19 (Thu) Please also pray for President Ashraf Gani and his wife Rula, protection, wisdom, integrity.

- 20 (Fri) Pray that the doors of religious freedom would become more and more open and that the people in this nation who have had revelations from God over the Ramadan period would not give up on their pursuit of truth.
- 21 & 22 (Sat & Sun) Pray for the City of Quetta, where there has been a lot of terrorist activity and is closed to foreigners. Pray for their safety and for seeing eyes to be made blind.
- 23 (Mon) Pray for changes of heart in the terrorists that they have visions, revelations, a change of heart and turn to the one true God.

CHINA

24 (Tue) The people in China's far west are under severe restrictions especially the Uyghur people who are mostly Muslim. Please pray for the Christian minority that they will be strengthened in their faith, and for super natural protection in the midst of this persecution. 25 (Wed) As they celebrated Eid al Fitr at the close of the month of Ramadan fasting, there are many reports of Muslims having had super-natural God give encounters over this Ramadan time.
