In the early years, Eddie would share his heart in the newsletters on what the Lord had been speaking to him through the Word and the battles of the brethren overseas. Following are two such reports.

November 1997

Beloved in Christ,

Greetings in the name of our wise God and Saviour, Jesus Christ to whom all glory and majesty dominion and power belong. One month closer to seeing Him, what a joy. Look up, for your redemption draws near. Our times are in His hands.

Today we received a fax saying that a pastor in Laos, who we have been praying for has been released from prison for health reasons, high blood pressure and heart problems. The police are watching him closely, and have warned him if he commits any unlawful acts (preaching the gospel), he will go right back to prison. I cannot see him out for long, he is an aggressive evangelist. Keep praying.

Laos is a very underdeveloped nation but has been accepted into the Association of South East Asian Nations (ASEAN). In its efforts to catch up with other member nations and to draw investors, it is opening its doors to expatriates with technical skills to help. This may be a good opportunity for you as a tentmaker to go and serve this nation with a God given mission.

I was just reading in Song of Solomon today in chapter 6 verse 11 'I went down into the garden of nuts to see the fruits of the valley, and to see whether the vine flourished and the pomegranates budded.'

Many times, Christians are called a heap of nuts and I felt it was a bit grim, but when I looked at this verse I felt good. The Lord has planted us in His garden, He is very interested in us at all times.

He graces us with His presence, He has done some sowing in our lives and He is checking on our fruitfulness. You think of nuts. They can endure a lot of hardship, go through many a storm and adverse conditions, can fall on the ground, be trodden on, but the nut inside is safe and sound and is very valuable to the owner. One thing must happen before the nuts are of any use to its owner, it must be broken.

So dear ones we must be available to the Lord to be broken that He might taste the fruit of His garden and enjoy the labour of His hand. So don't be troubled when someone calls you a nut, just agree and say you've been reading your bible, and that is exactly what the Lord says about me.

Whether in the valley where the Lord is looking for the fruit of suffering, or at the top of the tree rejoicing, Jesus will be there. The important thing is that we are fruitful and in His presence.

REFINING FIRE OF PERSECUTION

March 2000

Dearly Beloved,

Greetings to you all! As I looked at our photo in the last newsletter I realised just how youth was still very much on the side of each one of us. No wonder I had the energies to face the world. I was ready to see and do anything God would ask of us.

We had done our flight bookings for this world tour through KLM (Dutch Airlines) who gave ministers and those in ministry special concessions on their travel. Buy an economy ticket and they would upgrade you to Business Class.

What a way to see the world especially when they transfered us to other airlines in routes they never flew, some of them didn't have business class, so guess what? There we were up in front with all these first class passengers lapping up all the luxuries they offered us, all on an economy ticket! The Lord was so good, we were truly blessed indeed.

That trip in 1976 took us into Hungary, Poland, Romania, Czechoslovakia and East Germany, where we met these beautiful saints of God we'd heard about. Hearing is one thing, seeing, listening, weeping and worshipping with them is another. To be with people who had family members in prison or who had just come out themselves and singing songs of Praise like "Free, free, free. Christ has set me free" just does something to you.

These people were not bitter. Hurting yes, but rejoicing in hope. Their following Jesus was a real experience of walking in faith, to the extent at one home we arrived in Hungary a teenage girl was standing on the road. When she saw us she asked, "Who are you wanting?" in broken English. "Follow me please," she said when we told her and took us just a little way down the street where we parked the car under the house and quickly closed the door.

We went up this narrow staircase to meet her parents and family who greeted us with such love and took us into their family as if we had been dear friends for many years. We met many precious believers in that little house and heard of the great sufferings many were enduring (the man of this family was interrogated weekly).

On returning home we were able to provide them with many things they had requested. Eastern Europe was so different in those days. Our lives were ones of Hide and Seek. Us doing the hiding, the authorities the seeking, only it wasn't playing games. For these people it was their everyday life.

We asked this family how they knew we were coming. "It's like this" they said. "When God provides us with extra food we know it's for a purpose, that visitors are coming and so we were watching out for you and well prepared". God truly was going before us and we were blessed at every turn.

We know persecution brings revival. It is as a refining fire, something we hope we don't have to endure, but these people were zealous for their God and rejoicing in Him. One dear elderly Christian man said, "please pray for us, not that God will take Communism away from us, but strengthen us in it."

He could see the refining of the people of God in their persecution, and the Church was becoming strong and vibrant. We go visiting these people and wonder how on earth we can encourage them. Yet it's them that teach us so much, as they have learned by their suffering. "You don't need to say anything to encourage us" said one dear man, "you have come and that encourages us greatly."

Those times God took us to Eastern Europe were a true blessing and a time of building up my faith. As I look back and see the small seeds of faith and the Word of God, I was able to sow into the lives of young men, encouraging them to move into the ministry (their pastors being imprisoned) and to hear from them now as Pastors leading large congregations.

My heart overflows in thankfulness to God that He, for a short time, allowed me to have a small input into their lives. What a mighty God we serve!

1995 to 2005 - New Frontiers

"Go to Nepal" was the resounding word from the Lord to Neil in 1995. Everyone else was going with Eddie to Vietnam and Neil was going to go there too. But while in prayer, God's instruction was very clear. The Lord and Nepal were beckoning Neil which was confirmed by Eddie and Stephen Woolley. He could not disobey the call.

This was a pivotal trip for Neil and Mission Outreach. Dr Samuel Rai was the small teams contact and the call of God on this man's life was evident in many ways. Most importantly, it was confirmed by a vision Neil saw of a fruit tree with lots of fruit which had a lot of seeds and very little flesh.

'It would have been easy to have dismissed his vision as a pipedream, but as Neil and the others heard more of his (Samuel's) plan and later learned of his background, they came to understand why God had brought them in contact with Samuel and why he truly was God's chosen man for Nepal..." (Page 232) of 'To Catch the Wind')

Samuel's zeal for the Lord and the lost in Nepal has been inspirational, unwavering and very fruitful. With Eddie and the board of Mission Outreach's agreement, we have faithfully supported this man of vision and his ministry, GTN, since 1996 first helping with a small training centre, then printing bibles, New Testaments, School of Workers training material, outreach



booklets, support for pastors and families from the lower caste, Christmas Crusades, women's sewing training and much, much more.

the Golden Triangle and China and many others. Most board members attended the annual conferences, heard amazing reports, and encouraged and prayed for those working on the frontline in these difficult nations. They enriched our lives and challenged our faith in so many ways.

It was during the annual EAM conference in 2000 that Eddie met Brother Yun who had been on the beach of Swatow during the Project Pearl one million bible delivery of 1981. This was such an emotional and significant meeting for Eddie, and those of us from the MO board who were present.

As Brother Yun spoke to us, he shared how these bibles were not bought with money, but with blood. He shared of fishing boats bringing home boxes and not fish and that many were imprisoned and suffered because of their involvement with Project Pearl, but they were willing to pay the price. We were so blessed and privileged to have witnessed that meeting with Eddie and Brother Yun.

Many teams and overseas visits were taken to bless, encourage and feed the Lord's sheep. Such a memorable decade.

10 Bless Favour of God ministries to those suffering trauma and bless all the ways it brings the Kingdom of God to earth. Pray for expansion and provision in every area.

11 Pray that the Church unite and pray, and the bonds of fear would break, boldness would come as God's people stand in their identity as Beloved, with eyes fixed on the Lord.

12 Pray that mighty works and miracle testimonies would be real in our own lives day to day. Pray in faith and expectation to be used by God today, to have a heart revived and touching others.

13 Pray for comfort for families who are separated by distance or unforgiveness. Pray for courage to make new ways of connection and uphold each other.

14&15 Pray for the truth of releasing blessing to spread across the Church. Bless your own body and soul, bless your spouse, bless your children, bless every area in your life and the lives of others. Give glory to Jesus who is the Life released.

NEW ZEALAND

16 Pray that national and local governments would not support festivals of false religions, not making any agreement with them.

17 Pray for Pastor John and his wife who lead Nepali churches in Te Puke and Auckland. Bless John and his wife with zeal, grace, wisdom, divine strategies, breakthroughs, testimonies, joy in salvation for the glory of God. Pray they know the joyful singing of the Lord over them.
